John restored this

tractor which had been owned by the late Floyd Downs which he used for threshing doing custom work for farmers. Before this tractor, in the years 1923-26, Floyd had a steam engine and a water tank, which was needed to fill the engine

with water. This was an exciting time for children, when threshing time came along and we would be watching for this huge steamer slugging up the road, pulling the water tank and the threshing

machine: However, our parents had extra work. Dad would phone the neighbors and ask for help as you always exchanged help at threshing time. Mother would have extra men to sleep over, as well as for breakfast and then dinner and supper for 15 men more or less.

It was nothing for men to have three or four pieces of pie, afte their first course.

I can remember them leaving the water tank at the road overnight and taking it up to the spring creek in the morning to fill with water for the threshing which would probably last two or three days, depending on the amount of crop and the weather.
