If you're interested in weaving in this area, there are two groups in town: The Georgetown · Weaver's Guild and the · Heritage Handweavers.

The older group is the first one to organize with its beginnings dating back 25 years. The Heritage Handweavers began eight years ago when it was found there was a need for an evening group.

Eva Middleton is the president of both groups .The Georgetown Weaver's Guild once had about 20 members, but the group has dwindled to eight members.

They meet once per month in each other's homes and discuss business and hold a program where a member might teach a new style.

All the members are hobby weavers who make gifts for themselves or members of their family, she said.

Most have a 45" wide loom in their home. although you can buy them smaller, but it takes longer to make an item, Mrs. Middleton said.
