

Georgetown's eight year old Tara Hamilton is neither scared nor nervous about singing in front of what will possibly be the largest crowd she has been up against. Having sung for over


two years now, Tara said singing may become a profession for her. Accompanying Tara on piano will be Debbie Tilson.




