## Acton likes Flynn says campaign chief

Last Wednesday the NDP opened their campaign office for the Acton area at 201 Lakeview Road where Mr. Flynn talked political issues with the press.

An all candidates meeting has been tentatively set for Friday, Aug. 24 at 7:30 at the Acton High School although this has yet to be confirmed.

## Lobby groups prepare for candidates meeting

Local groups in the Halton Hills area are gearing themselves up for the upcoming all candidates meetings.

A questionnaire has been sent out on issues such as military funding, nuclear arms and Canada's role as a peacemaker to the party candidates in both the Halton and Brampton-Georgetown ridings by the Halton Hills Action for Nuclear Disarmament committee.

Acton representative for HAND, Eldon Comfort, has received positive replies from the NDP and Green parties and a partial reply from the Liberal party in Halton.

Mr. Comfort said Oriena Currie is checking with party policy before completing the questionnaire. The PC party candidate, Otto Jelinek, has yet to reply.

HAND representative for the Brampton-Georgetown area, Janet Duval, said the questionnaire sent out to the parties in her riding only consisted of two questions.

Should Canada continue to produce and test nuclear weapons and/or their components, and how can we, as a country, prevent nuclear war?

Mrs. Duval has received a reply from the Communist party who are in complete agreement with the HAND's association. She is expecting the rest of the replies within two weeks.

"The question of nuclear disarmament doesn't seem to be an issue in this election at all. I guess people just don't want to think about it," she said.

# Oriena Currie meets John Turner

Halton Liberal candidate Oriena Currie met prime minister John Turner Monday night along with 27 other women who are running as Liberal candidates across Canada.

The Ottawa meeting helped to prepare the prime minister for his debate Wednesday on women's issues.

The candidates went on the attack to try and find any weakness in their leader's platform or his ideas, but Mrs. Currie said, "he knows his job".

The meeting began by talking about women's issues, but the conversation also dealt with peace and issues that concern the population as a whole, she said.

On a personal level, Mrs. Currie said the prime minister looks at a woman's role as a partnership where they are treated equal. Her leader was quite candid about his own family and said his daughter isn't treated any differently when they go out on their canoe trips to remote areas, she said.

Mrs. Currie is still working at canvassing around the Halton riding, trying to get on areas where there are a lot of people such as the GO Train station, shift changes at Ford, plus main streeting and shaking the hands of shoppers at malls.

The malls have proved to be an effective medium because so many people aren't home, she said. They've also adjusted her campaign hours by stressing more door to door knocking in the evenings when more people are home.

While the prime minister is preparing for his Wednesday debate, Mrs. Currie will be at an all-candidates meeting in Milton August 23 and possibly in Acton the next night (the date is yet to be confirmed).

Her remarks will key on job creation which she feels is a major issue in her campaigning. She's also anxious to have the public respond to what they feel might be some solutions to Canada's problems.

Other plans for this week include a meeting in Georgetown with the Halton-Peel Co-op group at the Morley Mills Co-op building in River Run, Thursday night.

Canvassing door-to-door makes up the bulk of Mr. McDermid's daily activities.

"With so many new areas in Brampton, we have to get him out and keep his mug before the people," Mr. Upshall said.

Compaigning isn't just restricted to the Brampton area. Mr. McDermid has allotted one and a half days each week for canvassing in Georgetown, Mr. Upshall said.

Last Friday night, Mr. McDermid was door knocking in the River Run area, his campaign manager said.

Saturday, he entered a float in Brampton's Pine and Rose Festival along with the other parties' candidates and manned it with former Edmonton Eskimos football star David Fenell.
