# Warriors edged 2-1 in final

Georgetown Warriors travelled to Rexdale this weekend to take part in a Bantam Boys soccer tournament. The Warriors are a select team coached by Nunzio Varricchio, assisted by

Dan Donoghue and managed by Hudi Javerig.

In the preliminaries, Georgetown faced three tough opponents. In their first game against

Milton the slow starting Warriors put away Milton 3-2.

Striker Steven Pryor powered his way down the middle and opened the scoring, followed by

Terry Flynn, who put the rebound into the net. Simon Golding got the winner with a beautifully placed shot high on the short side.

In the second game with Oakville the Warri-

ors hit their stride. A scoreless game until the ten minute mark when Golding lofted a corner kick into the goal mouth that was put away by Mike Teetzel. Oakville

fought hard all the way with several good scoring chances.

An intentional hand ball with two minutes left gave Oakville a penalty shot, but Georgetown goalie Jay Corson met the challenge and preserved the win.

The third game was against Niagara Falls. Each team had several chances to score, but the game remained a draw for 50 minutes. Striker Pryor scored what turned out to be the winner as the Warrior defence held for the win.

The three wins sent the Warriors to the tournament final against Pine Point Park of Oakville. In the blistering heat Georgetown scored first on a pass re-directed by Pryor to Sean Cleary, who put the ball away. Oakville evaded the score to finish the first half.

In the second half there were good chances by both clubs, but it was Oakville who scored the deciding goal in the 2-1 decision.

In regular season play Georgetown travelled to Guelph to play the league leaders. Georgetown opened the score after 10 minutes when Terry Flynn's shot from the top of the goal went in. Next came Pryor who fired a bullet that beat the goalie on the short side.

Cleary scored the Warriors' third goal to end the half.

Guelph came back in the second half with two quick goals before Flynn netted his second goal of the game. Another rally by Guelph was halted when Cleary scored his second goal of the game to make the score 5-2 over a previously unbeaten Guelph team.

Georgetown will play next tomorrow night at 6:45 p.m. against the same Guelph team at Cedarvale.

Georgetown won the toss in their game against Oakville on Saturday. Skipper A. Windsor elected to bat.

T. Narine and N. Balkisson started the proceedings for Georgetown on a fast concrete Oakville pitch. T. Narine was soon dismissed for four. However Moolchan and Balkisson had complete command over Oakville bowling. The score moved briskly to 37 when Balkisson was declared out LBW for 22. Kumar joined Moolchan but was soon out caught for six. D. Anthony and S. Jahoor were both dismissed similarly caught for seven and 11 respectively. D. Samaroo met with an immediate success when he dismissed N. Ahmad for two making Oakville 119 for eight. However in the remaining 10 overs Georgetown were unable to get the last two batsmen out. D. Branch played solidly for Oakville to remain unbeaten with 31. S. Sharma was the top scorer in the Oakville innings with 40 out of a total of 136 for eight. Georgetown bagged 14 points for the game while Oakville salvaged nine points.

Sunday Game: Georgetown however had better luck on Sunday in their game against Toronto Nomads. Batting first Toronto Nomads were dismissed for 114. A. Kumar was the most successful bowler for Georgetown. Bowling leg breaks and googlies, Kumar caused havoc in the Nomad batting lineup. He captured six wickets for 31 runs. Sai was the top scorer for Nomads with 26 runs.

Alcott "C" Mixed Intercountry Tennis team defeated Mimico five matches to one in Intercountry tennis action last week.

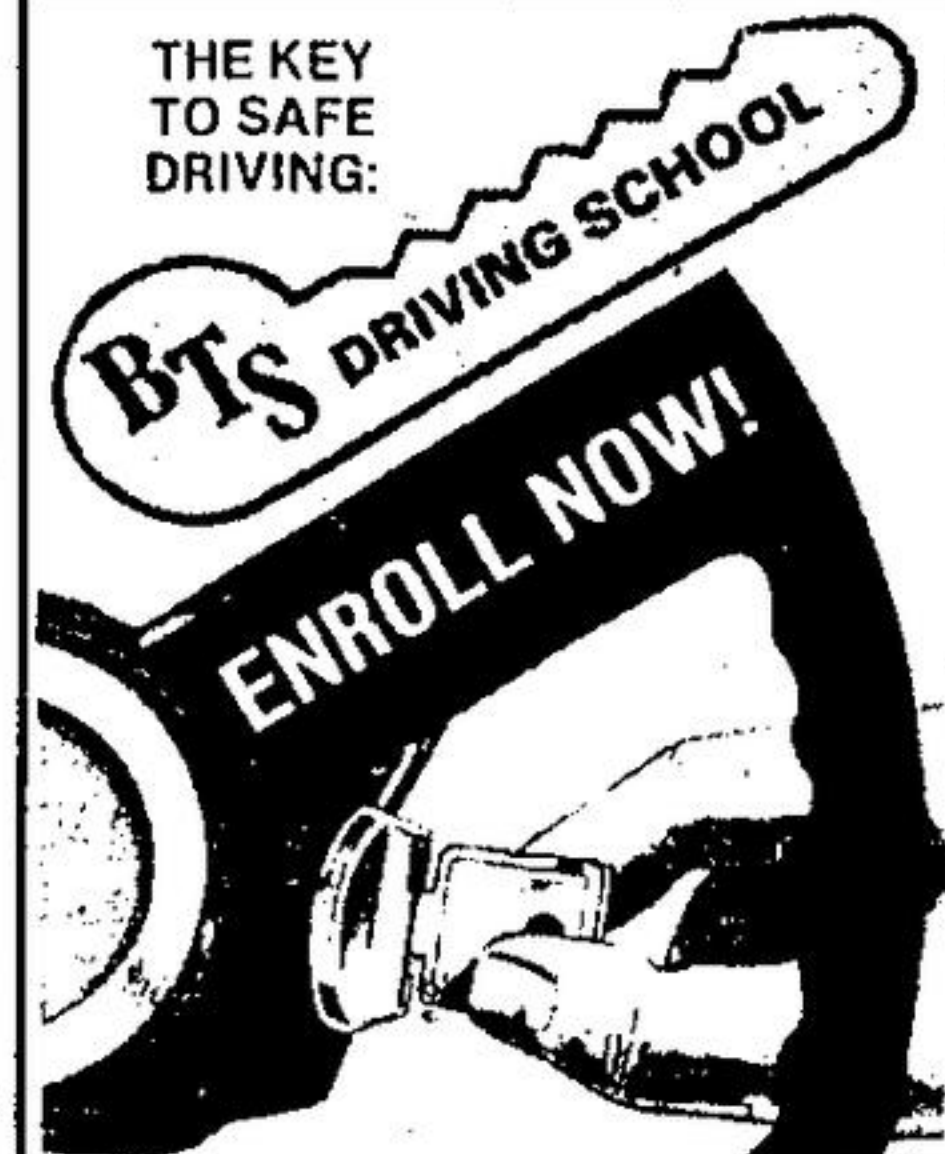
