Working together for young hockey players is the key to the Georgetown Minor Hockey Association, says a longtime executive member and coach.

Gord Stewart, who for 10 years was involved in the GMHA as an executive and juvenile hockey coach, said putting too much emphasis on the representative teams would end up hurting the organizati-

"It's important to look at how well we have done within our own group," he said. "If the teams are properly balanced, you can get the same effect of good hockey without leaving your own rink."
