**Wall art

Calling all artists. At least those who create what could be termed "Wall Art". The first annual Juried Exhibition of Wall Art is about to be held at the Halton Hills Library and Cultural Centre.

A chance to be chosen to exhibit your works of art is open to all residents of Halton Hills.

If you are a little unsure exactly what type of work is acceptable under the heading of "Wall Art", join the club. I too was unsure.

But I have now researched the subject and will pass my acquired knowledge on to you. Painting in the media of oil, acrylic and watercolour, wallhanging using fabric, drawing, mixed media and original prints including etching, lithography, woodcuts, linocuts and serigraphy are the acceptable categories.

Any one artist may submit up to three works, which must be original and executed within the last twelve months. Prizes will be given to the best work in each category.

The jury will consist of Charlotte Brainerd, graphic artist, Sybil Hampen, painter and fibre artist and Jack Reid, painter. The decision of the jury will be final.

If you have created a wonderful work, which it would blight your life to part with, do not submit it to this show. All submitted works must be for sale. The Halton Hills Library and Cultural Centre will take a 25 per cent sales commission on each work sold during the show.

The deadline for submitting entries is September 22. There is a non-refundable entry fee of \$3 per item. Bring your entries to the Halton Hills Library and Cultural Centre.

That is also the place to pick up a list of the requirements for each submission regarding size, framing, labelling etc. That should be your first step. The next is of course to get to work. Ply that needle, wield that brush. Show us what you can do.

Looking for descendants

Descendants of settlers are needed to sign a journey scroll carried by the Ontario Trail Riders Association (OTRA) when they travel through Ballinafad, August 24.

Mavis McCallum, OTRA chairman, said the names are needed to preserve the history of the area and to pay tribute to the early settlers. "It's an appropriate way to look back and remember those who have contributed so much."

"For the descendants there is a personal awareness and pride. The townspeople's pride can be sensed rather than seen," she said.

The OTRA, a non-profit organization dedicated to preserving recreational riding trails, started their ride July 24 from Depot Harbour on Georgian Bay. A second group of riders left July 28 from Timbertown on the Ottawa River.

Sponsored by the Ministry of Tourism and Recreation, the Bicentennial Office and the Ontario Equestrian Federation, the ride will trace historic, scenic and heritage routes. Mrs. McCallum said the long range plan of the ride is

to turn the route into a Bicentennial riding trail.

Councillor John McDonald, of the Halton Hills Bicentennial Committee, said the community was enthusiastic about the Trail Riders. "It's about time we played tribute to the role of horses in history," he said.

The riders will travel Trafalgar Road, a main artery of transportation for the province in the 1800s, enroute to the Scotsdale Farm. Coun. McDonald said the ride has historical tidbits about it. "Even the farm

is significant," he said. Owned by the Ontario Heritage Foundation, the Scotsdale farm is the only horse park in the province.

Halton Hills Mayor Russ Miller, said the ride will "bring out the history of Halton and help the community remember its humble but vital beginnings." Mayor Miller will present the riders with a history of Halton Hills and officially welcome them to the area, August 25 at 12:30 p.m.

The riders will be in Ballinafad August 24 from 4 - 6 p.m.

Favourite Recipes

LOW-CAL FRUIT FLAN

BASE: 8 digestive biscuits, crushed. Spread on bottom of pie plate or spring form pan.

MIX TOGETHER: 1-28 oz. can fruit cocktail
1 can mandarin oranges
2 cups plain yogurt
2 tbsp. sugar
Juice of 1/2 lemon
1 tsp. vanilla
Pour over crumb base, bake at 350° (325° if using pyrex pan) 35-40 minutes. Chill
