of her works entitled "An Artist of the Sixties". Born in the United States, she studied at the Walker Art Centre School in Minneapolis and the Ontario College of Art in Toronto.

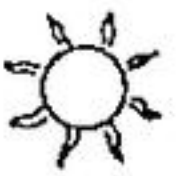
She started to exhibit in 1958 and was represented during the sixties in most of the large international exhibitions of original prints in Canada, the United States, Australia, South America and Europe. An exhibition at the Pollock Gallery, Toronto in 1966 was a great

critical and popular success. Her medium was a version of the etching process called "aquatint". Between 1966 and 1970 no other printmaker in Toronto was her equal in that medium.

All her later works are the result of her encounter with Buddhism. From "Sun Target" on her etchings and paintings are mandalas. In the Orient a mandala is a schematized representation of the cosmos. In 1970 she did her last etching and in 1971 she

stopped to paint. She had said what she wanted to say.

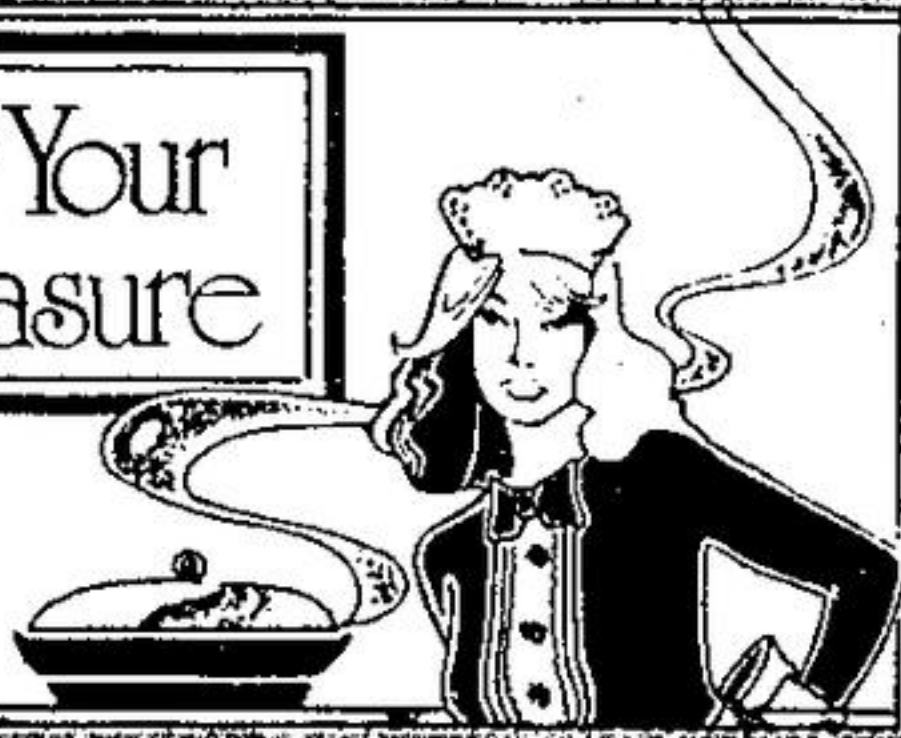

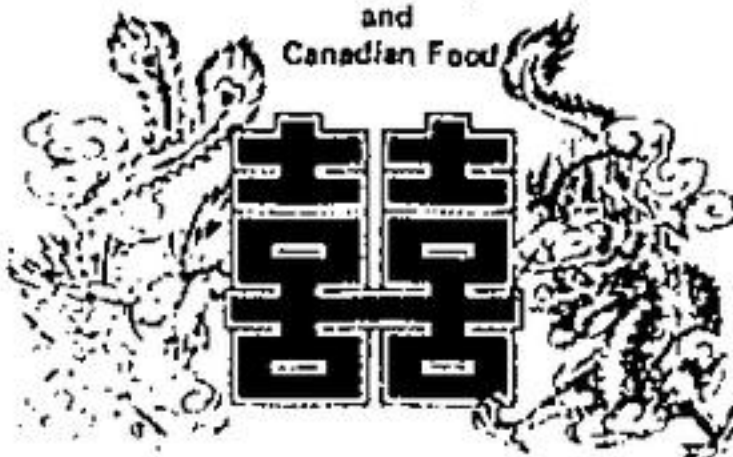
