The Credit Valley Artisans are offering you the chance to discover the artist within yourself. They are offering courses in many craft fields. Experienced instructors will work with you and help your budding talent to flower.

Courses offered include: Beginner's Adult Pottery. This course includes handbuilding techniques, ornamental texturing, glazing and kiln loading as well as two practice periods on the wheel. This is a ten-week course taught by instructor Christa Spencer.

Clay Sculpture is an eight-week course with instructor Dawn Connel. It will include an introduction to clay modelling and sculpture. Work in "low relief form" will be developed in the first part of the course. "In the round" will be featured in the later classes. All articles will be bisque-fired.

Folk Lore Painting will be taught by instructor Jackie Faubert. The student will be decorating old or new objects of wood, metal or glass using traditional Dutch motifs of flowers, birds etc.

You may bring your own objects to be decorated after the initial four instruction and practice periods of working on paper which will be supplied.

There are two courses for children. Children's Pottery is open to ages six to twelve. Your child will be instructed in the pinch, coil and slab methods of pottery building by instructor Grace McKnight. Also included will be clay texturing and colouring.

The other course for youngsters is Children's Art for those aged ten to fourteen years. Instructor Gretchen Day has designed this course for those students who are interested in art and are willing to work hard to increase their knowledge of the subject. Drawing, painting and sculpture projects will be done in a variety of media including charcoal, conte, ink, water colour and plaster.

As well as these continuing courses there are several workshops planned. These include: Stained Glass Workshop, Dough Decorating Workshop and Intermediate Rug Weaving Workshop.

If you are interested in registering for any of these excellent courses, you may do so by mail. Registration forms are available at the Public Libraries and Col Craft. You may also register in

person at the Cottage in Cedarvale Park on September 15, 10 a.m. to 12 noon.
