There were no formal lessons taken when Mrs. Roe began painting theatre sets and she credits her success at it with the confidence other people had in her. "They just said go ahead and do it," she said,

WAIT

Originally planning to move into the professional theatre with her set designing experience, Mrs. Roe, the mother of three, feels she has to wait until her children are older for that move.

Calling this "the year of the female", she said it was the ideal time to start her own business.

Size and subject matter pose little problem to Mrs. Roe although she said she prefers to stay clear of portraits and horses.

Some of the backdrops she has painted for the theatre have been 13 by 35 feet and have included landscapes, seascapes and a reproduction of Baveux tapestry chronicling the exploits of William the Conquerer.

Not just limited to walls Mrs. Roe said she could paint over panelling, doors, kitchen cupboards and almost any kind of furniture. Cartoons in a child's nursery, a cost of arms in an office, modern or 'traditional art are some of the examples Mrs. Roe gave which her service could do.

Working mostly with mat and semi-gloss paints Mrs. Roe said she will be charging between \$20 and \$25 per hour for her service. Anestimate would be given before any work would begin and Mrs. Roe said she would not go over the estimate without

permission. One of the problems

with this type of service is the inability to take the mural with you if you were to move. Mrs. Roe was quick to point out that when a family puts a swimming pool in their yard it stays with the home and may even help to sell the property, as she hopes her murals will do.

"This type of work is

exciting for me because the scope isn't limited. The ability to create and please people is there, as it is in the theatre." she said.


New name tags
