Town rejects bid for dog kennel

Show dogs will not have a home in Halton Hills, after town council ruled against the waiving of a bylaw which would permit kennel owners to purchase property on No. 5 Side-road, Part Lot 5, Conc. 6.
At a council meeting Sept. 4, Lou Parsons, representing the kennel owners, argued that the kennel operation would not interfere with the rural lifestyle enjoyed by neighbors in the area.
He said the kennels and dog runs are cleaned regularly, ensuring no odors would emanate from the property, adding the dogs are raised for training and showing, not to be sold.
Mr. Parsons commented that the property is heavily treed, in compliance with the bylaw, and the only way in which it does not conform is on the one side of the property which is 10 feet short of the requirement.
Challenging a number of objectors who were in attendance at the meeting, Mr. Parsons said he understood neighboring property owners had petitioned against the kennel when they owned chickens themselves.
He explained that applicants Mr. and Mrs. Edwards were seeking a new location for their operation, as the kennel in Mississauga was being crowded out, and the couple were looking for an equally quiet area to raise their dogs.
Representing the petitioners, Mr. Wayne Warner argued that the kennel would be encroaching on an area occupied by humans, and that it would interfere with the quiet enjoyment of the neighborhood, creating offensive odors.
