Disqualified driving

A 26 year old Cedar Springs Motel resident is facing charges of driving while disqualified, driving with no insurance, driving with a plate not authorized for the vehicle and impaired driving after she was stopped by Halton regional police on Highway 7 early Saturday morning.

Failure to remain

A Young Street residence in Acton sustained approximately \$200 in damages when a vehicle ran over its lawn and bit the porch on the weekend. There are no suspects in the case and Halton regional police are treating it as a failure to remain.

Outboard missing

An Evinrude outboard motor worth approximately \$500 was reported stolen to Halton regional police on Oct. 17 after an Alredale Court resident in Georgetown noticed it missing from the garage.

Stolen vehicle

Police tried but failed to apprehend two young people who fled from a stolen 1979 Chrysler on Hill Drive in Georgetown after the vehicle had been reported stolen from a Delrex Boulevard residence. An investigation is under way in the Oct. 18 incident. There was no damage to the vehicle.

Pony scratched

A 1984 Pony received a six foot long scratch causing approximately \$400 in damages while it was parked at Zellers in Georgetown on Friday evening.

Break and enter

A total of approximately \$5,000 in goods were stolen from a residence on the 5 Sideroad over the weekend when the front door of the home was forced open.

Included missing in the break and enter were a television, camera, radio, tools and a variety of other items.

Vet returns to Europe for squadron reunion

Herald Special Harry Clarke was flying high again with his friends after nearly a 40 year absence.

The Georgetown resident flew with 25 members of his old 31 Squadron of the Royal Air Force from Norwich airfield in England to the squadron's operational base at Bruggen in Germany.

The reunion two weeks ago was particularly memorable because the retired air pilots were flown in a DC3. The 31 Squadron used the Douglas DC3 during the Burma campaign, where they gained battle honors in North Burma 1943-44, Arakan 1943-44, Manipur 1944 and Burma 1944-45.

Harry Clarke was a member of the RCAF serving in Coastal Command in England until he went out to Burma to join the Squadron towards the end of the war.

As a Flight Lieutenant pilot, he did seven hours operational flying within the first 24 hours of his arriving there, carrying payloads of 6,000 lbs. internally or up to 7,000 lbs. for air-drops.

While the wrist and the break above the knee have healed, the three breaks below the knee require him to wear a brace as the bones in the lower leg are still moving.

A damaged knee cap is still giving him a problem and a muscle graft

has been required on the shin as well, since a piece of the muscle was missing from an opening two inches wide by three inches long.

The doctors say it may take a year before they know how the leg will

respond. All this misadventure for Jamie because a dog was running at large without a leash.
