On October 24, the senior students at Georgetown District High School attended an assembly for the Red Cross to kickoff a blood donor clinic, which is being sponsored by the GDHS marketing club.

As a result of the assembly, over 50 people volunteered to give blood.

Every day, the Canadian Red Cross blood program needs over 4000 blood donations of every

type. Most persons in good health between the ages of 17 and 66 find it quite easy to give blood.

The actual process only takes 10 to 15 minutes. A donation may be life saving in the treatment of hemophilia, specific bleeding problems, anemia, leukemia, infectious diseases, extensive burns, and "Rh babies".

The Red Cross is coming to the school Nov. 7 to take the blood donations, and during the next week before that, you'll find posters all over the school encouraging everyone to give blood. Help someone out. It could be you.
