- 1/8 tsp. pepper
- 2 tsp. oil
- 2 medium onions
- 2 cups sauerkraut, drained
- 2 cups canned tomatoes, with juice

Combine ground beef, bread crumbs, egg, salt and pepper; shape into small meat balls. Heat oil in heavy skillet and brown meatballs, turning occasionally. Cut onion in wedges and add with drained sauerkraut and canned tomatoes to meatballs. Simmer in covered skillet for about 1 hour. Serve with dumplings or buttered noodles.
