## Acton resident wants centre for youths

"To the police: Am I under arrest or charged with an offence? If not, I have nothing to say and wish to leave at once. If I am, what is the offence? If under arrest or charged I will identify myself fully but have nothing else to say. I demand my right to contact my lawyer immediately."

That, if Kayla Popp has her way, will be the message printed on T-shirts which may soon become available in Acton.

The question Miss Popp is contemplating is if the T-shirts will "only add fat to the fire".

"That's not what we want," she said.

The 27 year old Acton resident has already applied to the town for a hawkers and peddlers license and is hoping the sales from the T-shirts will help with lawyer fees for the Acton youth and help fund a community centre for local residents.

It is proposed that one dollar from each of the \$3 T-shirts sold, be put towards the Youth Legal Aid Fund (YLAF) and an additional dollar put towards funds to get a community centre underway.

Miss Popp has been active in trying to organize a community centre in Acton after Halton regional police laid several jolting charges against local youth last summer.

Having started school in September, Miss Popp said she has not had the time to pursue acquiring a community centre in Acton, but said she is now confident school is going well and is starting the quest again.

She said she will be approaching town council on the idea in the near future, and at the same time, or shortly after,

would like to talk to Halton regional police Chief James Harding on the situation.

Miss Popp said local merchants she has approached in Acton have been very positive towards the idea of a community centre.

"Even the ones who don't like the young people were positive," she said.

She would like to see the community centre not only as a place for the Acton youth, but for everyone in the community.

Mrs. Joan Phillip, another Acton resident, can sympathize with Miss Popp's dilemma.

Mrs. Phillip said while she is not familiar with the older age group of kids in Acton, her niece and nephews in Scotland, who are in their late teens, go to the disco-technique, which Acton also lacks.

**Halton Hills Arts Council**

Local artist Gretchen Hamilton Day has an exciting exhibition of paintings in her future. Her work will be on display at the University Women's Club of Toronto.

The exhibition begins with a by invitation only grand opening on Sunday, Nov. 11 from 1 to 4 p.m. After this it will be open to the public until Dec. 22.

Now a word about the performing arts. First I must stress that I did not see the Georgetown, Little Theatre production of *Bilthe Spirit*. Even so I must speak out about a review I read of the production. My qualifications for doing so are the fact that I have seen three previous professional productions of this play and the movie.

The review suggested that Noel Coward wrote long stretches of dreary dialogue, to be spoken by boring people. He did not. He wrote witty dialogue to be spoken by sparkling people.

The review had the nerve to suggest, that editing portions of Coward's work might have been in order. Just who does the reviewer think has the required talent to edit the work of a master.

It is my contention, that the fault is not in the play. The review seems to feel that Madame Arcati is the most interesting character in the play. I have seen the role played by such fine actresses as Bea Lillie, Margaret Rutherford and Tammy Grimes. They made the most of what is a great comedic role.

But they never made you forget that the main focus of the play is the relationship between Charles Condomine and his two wives.

Noel Coward was called the Master by his friends and in the field of drawing room comedy he most certainly was. "*Bilthe Spirit*" is one of his masterpieces.
