**McKnight pottery on display**

If you want to meet a unique person doing a unique sort of work, try visiting Grace McKnight at Charis Pottery in Glen Williams.

The amiable artist now has her rare crystalline art-pottery on display at the Georgetown Library. The crystalline glazed porcelain will be there until Nov. 15 when the exhibit moves to her studio and shop for two weekend open houses: Nov. 17 and 24 from 10 a.m. - 6 p.m. and Nov. 18 and 25 from 12 noon until 6 p.m.

Since the spring Grace has worked with the medium of crystalline art. Recently she won acclaim for her work by being chosen to display her pottery at the Richmond Art Gallery in British Columbia.

Her entries were judged at a juried art exhibition and a showing is planned after May '85 in the gallery located just outside of Vancouver.

Her display at the Georgetown Library was arranged by professional designer-displayer from Halton Hills, Alissa Finnis.

At her store and studio in Glen Williams (you'll recognize her place on the Main Street from the large wooden crafted mailbox) Grace has a selection of her latest work, along with Christmas gift selections.

She's encouraging parents to bring their children along to learn how to create their own pots. Her crystalline glazed porcelain is a rare art-pottery. The form stands on its own and isn't necessarily serving a function, she says.

"Since I was very young I have been fascinated by snowflakes and frost patterns on glass and am delighted to be able to reproduce this effect on porcelain, she says."

Gallery House Sol on Charles Street in Georgetown is hosting two new artists beginning Nov. 10.  
That day oil painter Shizuye Takashima and iron sculpter Andreas Drenters will be available to talk to patrons.  
The exhibition at the gallery will last until Nov. 29.  
Two years ago Shizuye Takashima exhibited 12 paintings at House Sol, inspired by the English poet William Blake.  
This time she has prepared a series of 20 paintings with the group title "Homage to Life".  
Each one of these new oil paintings celebrates the force and energy of life on this planet.  
Her paintings are in the collection of great public museums like the National Gallery in Ottawa and the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre in Toronto.  
Andreas Drenters moved with his family from Pickering to Rockwood a year ago, to take residence in the famous "Old Academy" there, his late brother Josef Drenters' former home.  
He exhibits small and medium sized pieces in the material he has become so well known for: found iron from farm machinery and other assorted sources.  
His often humorous always imaginatively assembled sculptures entertain and delight.  
Both artists will be at House Sol Nov. 10 from 2-6 p.m.  
The gallery is open to the public on Tuesday to Thursday from 2-8 p.m. - on Friday to Sunday from 2-6 p.m. Admission is free.
