

Lost child stresses streetproofing need

Prevention of sexual and physical abuse as well as kidnapping risks can save parents and children a lot of heartache.

The Halton Children's Aid Society encourages parents to "streetproof" their children by teaching them how to react to potentially risky situations, and to follow rules which will help protect them.

The streetproofing issue came into focus in Georgetown recently when a small child was discovered alone on a busy street in town.

When residents in the area could not identify the child, and a quick search of the area yield-

ed no missing parents, police were called in. The irony in this situation was that the child, visibly frightened by the group of strange adults and police officer, revealed no clues as to her identity.

Most children are taught not to talk to strangers from a very early age, but if this message could be expanded to help older children understand that police officers and Block Parents are adults who can be trusted, children could more quickly be returned to their parents.

In this instance, Gary and Elaine Frei, local Block Parents were quick to respond to the crisis, by opening up

their home, and providing warm clothing and food to the lost child. Their hope was that once the youngster began playing with their own two children, a name could be drawn out, or some other clue to the child's identity.

Indeed, the mystery began to unfold, as the child relaxed during play with his new friends, and it was quickly revealed that the blue-eyed child identified as a lost little girl was in fact a boy.

This was a major factor which delayed reuniting the youngster with his parents, who by this time were frantic when their report to police of a missing boy turned up no results.

"We know he's all

right, but the parents don't," commented Mrs. Frei, concerned about the worry the parents were going through.

Eventually, the two reports were matched up, and the small boy was safely returned to his parents' home. The child had apparently decided to go for a walk, had become disoriented, and in trying to find his way home, had wandered some distance, in an area where to a three-year-old, "all the houses look the same."

This incident demonstrates the importance of close supervision for small children, and parents are advised to ensure their children know their names and addresses, to report to a trusted adult, such as a police officer or Block Parent.

Increasing reports of missing children across Canada are causing alarm among parents, professionals and community groups alike. The Citizens Concerned with Crime Against

Children stresses the following rules: an unattended child is a child at risk.

Arrange with your child an alternative place to wait if you are delayed, especially in the darker winter evenings. Suggest a well-lit store or inside an arena or school.

Always where possible, have children walk in pairs or groups. Children should always travel the same way home.

Use a secret family code. Children should never go with anyone, not even a close family friend, unless they are able to give the child the

code. Once the code has been used, it should be changed.
