Town councillors approved an application for a \$4,200 loan to J. Murray Brownridge of RR2 Georgetown Monday night in their committee meeting.

The loan is subject to funds being available under the Tile Drainage Act from the Ministry of Agriculture and Food.

Although the initial drainage loan allocation for the town this year was \$2,500, the Ministry of Agriculture and Food upped it to \$30,400 late in August, as additional monies became available.
