A Blood Donor Clinic held Nov. 7 at Georgetown District High School, turned out to be a great success.

The clinic was advertised by the grade 11 marketing club (MECCA).

True Rebel spirit and a willingness to share shone through as 106 people volunteered that day. Eighty-seven units of blood were collected altogether, as there were nine deferrals. Twenty members of the swim team were willing, but unable to give that day because of a meet. But four days later, ten of those members attended a public clinic. That brings our school's total to ninety-seven units.

AHS science day

Acton High School will present a 'Pure Science Exposition' day which will feature displays and projects which individual students from Grade 10 to 13 have accomplished.

New homes in Acton

The new homes will replace a three-unit multiple attached residential structure which is now in disrepair.

Town councillors gave their approval to developer B. Skoko to go ahead Monday night.

The town treasurer has requested one lot levy, instead of four as there are already three homes on the property.

The same interpretation was used in charging \$1,250 cash in lieu of parkland to be paid to the town.

"We thought it only fair to allocate for one as there are currently three units (on the property)," town planner Ian Keith said.

Before building permits are issued, site plan approval must be received.
