Training program

Hiring setback for housing coordinator

The hiring of a housing co-ordinator was again delayed and instead, regional planning director Raj Mohammed asked to get together with the planning directors of Halton Hills, Oakville, Milton and Burlington.

After a rather lengthy debate, regional councillors last week voted to have Mr. Mohammed and the planning directors come up with a way to complete a housing statement for Halton and its area municipalities.

Early this year, a staff report stated the region's role in housing would be that of facilitator, co-ordinator and provider of research information.

As a result of the report, councillors approved in the 1984 budget, \$35,000 towards the cost of the Housing Study, conditional on Halton receiving \$35,000 in provincial funding. The \$70,000 study was to be done in-house with contract staff and the hiring of a housing co-ordinator on a two year contract.
