Add:
 3/4 c. white sugar
 2 eggs
 1 tbsp. lemon juice
 1 tsp. vanilla
 Beat till light and fluffy. Line medium (1 1/2") muffin or tart tins with paper cups. Place a van-

illa wafer in the bottom of each cup. Fill cups two-thirds full. Bake at 350F for 15-20 mins. or until just set. Top each with one tbsp. cherry pie filling. Chill - keep refrigerated.

NORVAL - Pinegrove Community Club enjoyed a tour of the Brain Manor at RR1, Norval last Monday.

The former Brain Brewery was a log building in 1844 and had a capacity for using 300 bushels a year.

That was soon replaced by a large brick building where 10,000 bushels of hops were converted into beer. A small village of workmen's cottages was grouped around the brewery as the industry provided occupation for a large number of men.

Now the old brewery is gone with just the wall of the ice house remaining. However, Elsie Usherwood and her late husband, bought the farm three years ago from Fred and Clara Robert-

son and gave the old house a face lift.

The Victorian style home with its pine floors, lovely woodwork and open staircase are a joy to behold. A spacious family room, combined with a kitchen, has an island fireplace and a huge bay window with a table and chairs which looks out on the race track.

There are 40 odd hors-

es boarded and trained by Dave Ballard on the property. Upstairs you can sit and watch the horses and riders go through their jumps.

Following the tour all returned to Spencer and Kay Wilson's home, where Chester Early chaired a short business meeting, and arrangements were made for the Christmas party.
