# Water keeps on running

To keep your taps gushing fresh water, the region's planned to repair 226 broken water-mains next year.

That's just one of the water maintenance projects proposed for the north in the 1985 regional budget.

The public works department also plans to repair 225 water service connections, 1,070 hydrants and 140 main valves.

They hope to install 1,500 new water meters and complete 3,200 water meter service calls.

These repairs will keep water flowing into homes and businesses, improve the fire protection system and maintain water meters in working condition.

The cost for all this has been estimated at \$484,650 next year. That's up 30 per cent from last year.

# Acton firm pays \$8,000 for water main

Holly Industries in Acton got an even better deal with the region toward the cost of upgrading a watermain on Eastern Avenue.

Last week, regional councillors voted to only ask the company to put \$8,000 towards the \$60,000 project which will provide Holly Industries and The Olde Hide House next door, with better fire protection.

Originally, the region had wanted the company to pay \$16,000, or 25 per cent of the project cost.

Fire chief Bill Cunningham had identified a serious water flow deficiency for the present building in which sulphur is refined.

Without the 150 millimeters in diameter watermain, the company was not allowed to build a 3,600 square foot addition.

The region will pick up the remaining cost of the watermain.

The watermain will go along Eastern Avenue from west of Hillcrest Street to Young Street.
