Acton firm pays Hockey bag theft. \$8,000 for water main

Holly Industries in Acton got an even better deal with the region toward the cost of upgrading a watermain on Eastern Avenue.

Last week, regional councillors voted to only ask the company to put \$8,000 towards the \$60,000 project which will provide Holly Industries and The Olde Hide House next door, with better fire pratection.

Originally, the region had wanted the company to pay \$16,000, or 25 per cent of the project cost.

Fire chief Bill Cunningham had identified a serious water flow deficiency for the present building in which sulphur is refined.

Without the 150 millimeters in diameter watermain, the company was not allowed to build a 3,600 square foot addition.

The region will pick up the remaining cost of the watermain. ...

The watermain will go along Eastern Avenue from west of Hillcrest Street to Young Street.
