Break 1/2 spagnetti into greased 2 quart casserole. Cover with 1/2 of sauce and 1/2 of cheese. Repeat layers. Cover and take at 350° for 30 minutes. Uncover and bake another 15 minutes. Makes 6-8 servings.
