

### Car hit

What is believed to have been a beige colored vehicle caused approximately \$500 in damages to a 1974 Datsun which was parked on Churchill Road South in Acton, Feb. 1. Police are treating the evening incident as a fall to remain.

### Tank missing

## Anti-porn speaker gives Toronto talk

Georgetown's Gail Rutherford, from Citizens Against Violent Pornography, was a guest speaker and panelist at the Canadians for Decency Conference at the Prince Hotel, Toronto, Feb. 2. About 300 people were present to hear speakers such as Dr. Victor Cline, a psychologist and sex researcher, Dr. Robin Badgley of the Badgley Commission which looked into child pornography and prostitution, and Maude Barlow, a former advisor to Pierre Trudeau. In his talk, Dr. Cline revealed four characteristics common to regular users of pornography: addiction, escalation, desensitization and the final stage, acting out. ## Our industrial land needs outlined in region study

Councillor Pam Sheldon was pleased Monday night with the region's revisions of the Halton Rural Industrial Land Needs Study. "I'm pleased to see the region thought so highly of our recommendations to them that they have agreed with practically everything we said," Coun. Sheldon said. "It really looks like we wrote it." The study, prepared by Peter Barnard Associates, looked at future industrial growth in the region's rural areas. It was presented to regional council in December 1983, then circulated for comments to interested groups, agencies and departments, including the region's four municipalities. In the summer, Halton Hills councillors sent off their comments, many of which were incorporated in the recently released revised report. The report recognizes the shortage of available industrial land in the town and places a priority on resolving that. Acknowledging there is limited interim urban industrial development capability in Halton Hills, the study recommends lands within the new urban area boundary (north of Sideroad 10 in Georgetown south) be developed on water only, until the Georgetown sewage treatment plant has been expanded. This recommendation depends on there being sufficient water supply in Georgetown, which is currently under study.

## Elks find a new home




After nine years at the same location on Mountainview Road North, the Elks are temporarily homeless. Elks Lodge 540 officially moved from their hall last September 30 and are now using the Sacre-Coeur Hall on Guelph Street for their meetings and Monday night bingo. Harold Colpitts, treasurer for the Elks, said a furniture and appliance dealer from Acton will be using the location. The Elks, who number 56, and the 25 women who form the Order of the Royal Purple, had been paying over \$1,500 monthly for the hall. Mr. Colpitts said hall rentals are down and monies are tight with the financial pinch. He said while in other years the Elks had managed to raise \$20,000 yearly through rentals of the hall, as of September, 1984 they had only raised \$5,000 through rentals. The local Elks are currently looking for a new lodge for their members who come from as far as Waterloo and Burlington. "After nine years in the same location it's awkward moving. People are still calling the hall for rentals," Mr. Colpitts said.


