Dump search costly

The search for a suitable regional dump has cost Halton Hills \$47,650, according to Dave Birkett of the finance department.

The total bill to the region so far is \$953,000. Mr. Birkett estimated Halton Hills has paid 4 1/2 to 5 per cent of that total.

Tipping fees, paid each time a tonne of garbage is dumped off at the Burlington landfill, have raised the money for this search.

Of course, \$953,000 brings the region only to the point where one site is marked as most suitable. Another \$30,000 still has to be spent to prepare the documentation for submission to the province for an environmental assessment.

Then, there will be unknown costs for an environmental hearing, more detailed hydrogeological work and other field work.

If the environmental assessment is approved, then the cost of getting an Environmental Protection Act approval and planning and financial approvals remain.

The EPA approval is basically the license to dump the garbage.

The lengthy and costly procedure is expected to take several years.

Stewarttown news

STEWARTTOWN - One of the few remaining descendants of the pioneer Morrison family still in this area, Jane (Morrison) Treleven, passed away recently and sympathy is extended to her daughter, Mrs. Johnny Lindsay and her grandchildren of Alice Township.

William Morrison donated land in 1849, at the corner of his farm, Lot 15 (Conc. 8) Trafalgar Road, opposite our present St. John's, for the second location of the Church of England.

Some members of the congregation had left the first church because it had been built on the hill at the cemetery and access was difficult at certain seasons.

The Morrison family were active in the then thriving village of Stewarttown and in the Church of England for many years. James H. Morrison, teacher at the two storey school, his wife Zillah, and Hugh Morrison, Grandfather of Jane (Morrison) Treleven, held offices in the church until around 1920.

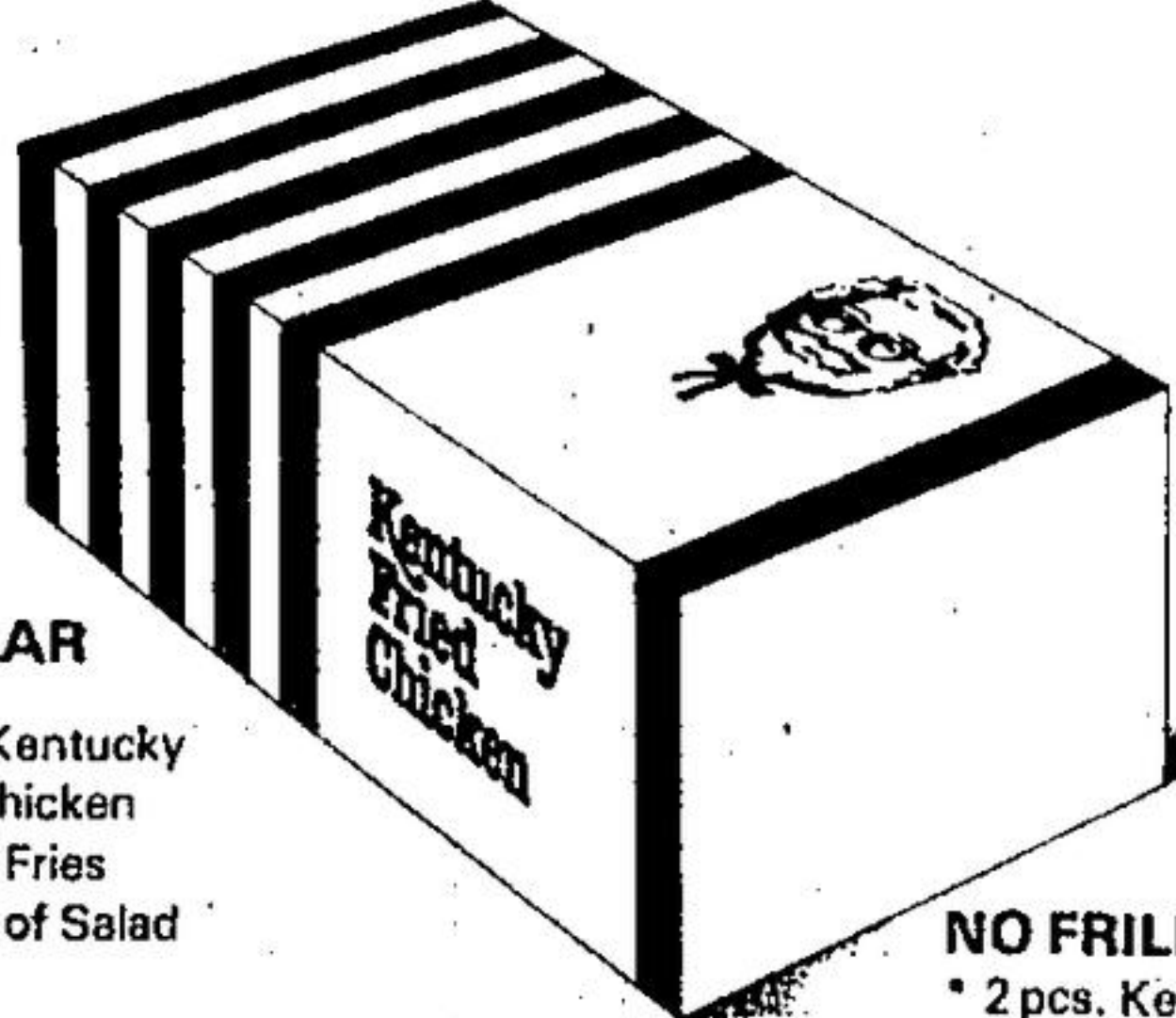
