The pressure caught up with the boys coached by Ralph Miller and despite his best efforts, it could not be overcome in time to preserve the lead. The team members, Brian Bell, Barry McLean, David Hilday, Ian Vint and Ian Wilkes can only look on in future success by taking to heart coaches' advice. Their drive in the final frames fell short and relegated them to third place.

The junior girls' team on the same afternoon started 28 pins behind top place Avondale 1045 to 1072. In the second game they fell another 6 pins behind and in the third were not able to make up that deficit, and finished in second place. The team really rolled over all opposition, throwing a 3407 triple, 350 pins more than the closest opponent, Brampton and Avondale. Jane Hika, Kelly McCarty, Karen Doyle, Cindy Kavanagh and Teresa Mastach feel very proud of their effort which was even better by 300 pins than the best of the boys. The coach provincial championship in tournaments this season is confident that this will be a third success.
