Every neighborhood has one, and so does every office.

Steal a kiss or slip in late, somebody's sharp gaze has caught it.

Nothing escapes the keen and curious eye of the busybody or the office gossip.

Friday night, Georgetown Little Theatre proved this with their first play in 1985, the comedy "Busybody".

The hilarious three-act play by Jack Poppetwell opened Friday and carries on tonight through to Saturday. Tickets are still available, by calling 877-3700.

Directed by Ron Hill, the play centres on a mysterious murder, in which the body and various bits of evidence appear then suddenly disappear during an investigation by Detective Superintendent Harry Baxter (Ron Hunt).

A testy character with a miserable cold and personality, Insp. Baxter finds the investigation a thoroughly frustrating one.

Particularly aggravating for him is the fact that the cleaning lady who calls in the murder is an old acquaintance from his childhood.

He has a hard time trying to control her as she walks all over him while he tries to conduct interviews with the murder suspects.

Lily Piper (Margaret Eggleton) has no fear of the inspector and his high position. She quashes his hat a couple of times by accident, and reminds

Superintendent Baxter that he took her out once and tried some hanky panky.

His attempts to teach Mrs. Piper when to open and close her mouth fail and Sup. Baxter suffers for his tyranny as the plot thickens.

Casting couldn't have been better for this play. From her sturdy black shoes to her hands on her hips, Margaret Eggleton puts on a superb performance as Mrs. Piper.

She has her lines down pat and acts comfortable with the character, making the audience feel comfortable with her as well.

As the Inspector, Ron Hunt did a fine job, particularly in the last scenes. Other than for some serious problems with his lines, Mr. Hunt carried it off, especially when it came to blowing his nose.

Vickie Reynolds, played by Edith Behie, came across very comfortable on stage. The secretarial assistant exuded a sense of humor and a naturalness which enhanced the part.

Also commendable were the unpopular land developer Richard Marshall (John Day), Det. Const. Goddard (David Harris), wife Claire Marshall (Jacky Willows), secretary Marian Selby (Margi Gibson), and handsome Robert Westerby (David Clifton).

As one has come to expect of the Georgetown Little Theatre, the lighting and set design and furnishing were well done, despite a short turnaround period after the recent production of Blithe Spirit.

This report will be submitted to all groups in this community with an interest in the arts. I am using the word "Art" in its widest sense to include performing arts, crafts, music etc. etc.

Once all interested groups have seen this report, there will be an opportunity for them to add to it, delete from it, change it as necessary to reflect a consensus of opinion.

From this process will emerge a formal Arts Policy Statement. This will be presented to Town Council and if accepted will become the official Arts Policy of Halton Hills.

As you can see now is the time to get involved. All arts groups could be affected by this, especially those who deal in anyway with any town department.

Many communities have had an official Arts Policy for years. We do not. It is time we did. In researching past work done in other communities it was discovered that in most cases an umbrella group, usually an Arts Council submitted such a proposal to Town Council. We are willing to do this.

The newly chartered Royal Canadian Air Cadets in Acton are asking the town for \$2,500.

Sponsored by the Acton Legion, Branch 197, the cadets were chartered last August end, and currently have 60 young people in the corps.

Of that \$2,500 grant, \$500 is for operating the program and \$2,000 is a one-time grant to cover start-up costs.

The legion has several fund-raising projects in progress to try and raise up to \$100 per cadet per year, making the corps budget \$6,100 to the end of August 1985.

PEANUT HONEY-OAT COOKIES

1/2 c. butter
1/2 c. peanut butter
1/3 c. brown sugar
1/4 c. liquid honey
1 egg
1 tsp. vanilla
1 c. flour
1 1/2 tsp. baking powder
1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 c. rolled oats
1/2 c. chopped peanuts

Cream together butter, peanut butter, brown sugar and honey. Add egg and vanilla. Beat well. Sift in flour, baking powder and salt. Stir in rolled oats and peanuts. Drop from teaspoon onto greased baking sheet. Bake at 375° for about 10 minutes.
