Man stands trial for criminal negligence

Judge Douglas Latimer found enough evidence for Keith Rieger to stand trial for criminal negligence causing death. A preliminary hearing was held last Wednesday in Milton provincial court.

The charge stems from a Dec. 18 accident which claimed the life of Kenneth Morrow. The car Mr. Morrow had been a passenger in hit a bridge abutment and rolled into the creek below, trapping the Georgetown teenager.

Court heard evidence from a number of witnesses who were at the scene of the accident in Glen Williams.

Mr. Rieger's lawyer said the evidence fell short of what one would normally expect, in order to warrant a charge of criminal negligence causing death.

Judge Latimer said Mr. Rieger would also be charged with impaired driving and driving over the legal limit.

Mr. Rieger, a Sixth Line resident in Esquesing, has chosen to be tried by judge and jury in district court.

House ransacked

Approximately \$5,000 worth of goods were stolen from a Langstone Crescent residence after entry was gained by breaking a kitchen window Friday afternoon.

A television, VCR, tape deck and speakers, hunting and fishing equipment, a bottle of rye and jewellery were among the items taken during the break and enter.

A Milton teenager has been charged with mischief to public property after he caused several hundred dollars damage to a police cruiser by kicking it. The vehicle was parked on Park Avenue in Georgetown March 23 during the incident. The Milton youth was arrested March 28.

Rides away with mower

A farm in Rockwood had a riding lawnmower, rotor tiller and push lawnmower stolen from its barn. The goods, which are worth approximately \$3,500, were taken sometime during daylight hours on Saturday.

Car on fire

Firefighters were called to an area west of Speyside on Friday to deal with an automotive fire. Approximately \$3,500 in damages occurred to a vehicle after a fire broke out in the engine area due to a mechanical or electrical problem.

Child subsidy ends on tenth birthday

The region's social services staff are worried about children who turn 10 being left unsupervised and often alone because the province doesn't subsidize day care for that age.

Families who've had subsidized day care for their children up to the age of 10 do not, once the child turns 10, often have the budget to enroll their children in a community program or pay for a sitter.

The region's staff would like the Ministry

of Community and Social Services to extend the day care subsidy to cover children up to their 13th birthday.

They've prepared a resolution noting children under 13 are often not mature enough to stay alone and unsupervised, birthday.

The Esquesing Historical Society helped in determining a name for the roads.
