The good news was the Central Ontario Junior "B" League team had no outstanding debts remaining. The bad news was the amount of money in the team's bank account was not that much.

"The first thing we must do is get some money in the bank to get our players some decent equipment," President Dave Barrager said.

Another situation Barrager faces is the resignation of secretary Karen Harrison. Harrison resigned Wednesday night at the team's election of officers meeting Wednesday night.

She cited the resignation on the return of general manager and coach Jules Russiani to the positions they held last year.

Harrison had forwarded a motion at the meeting that the executive advertise the jobs for those people interested, but it was voted down by the executive.

When Russiani and Webster were voted back as coach and general manager respectively, Harrison submitted her resignation.

"There is a bit of dissention from the point of view of the disappointment factor for the past couple of seasons. When you go through the year with 10 wins, five ties and 25 losses, it becomes a

long year.

"Everyone likes a winner and don't like a loser and our gates show that," he said. "I think the motion was put forth because perhaps an alternative idea is out there."

Barrager also faces the prospect of finding six individuals to fill the number of positions available in the Geminis' executive.

"We're hoping for hockey-minded people from the town who are interested in Junior "B" hockey, getting involved and performing a community service."

## IT'S BETTER TO BE AT HOME

Ongoing medical care no longer has to mean an extended stay in hospital. Most people recover faster and feel better in the comfort of their own home.

Across Ontario, the Ministry of Health's Home Care Program can bring the health services you need right to your doorstep - services like visiting nurses, physio and other therapies, drugs, dressings and medical supplies, laboratory services. Homemaking and meals-on-wheels are purchased from local community services as needed.

There is no charge, if you qualify. To be eligible you must be under the medical supervision of a doctor, and need a professional health service that cannot be met on an outpatient basis.

Here's how it works. On the advice of your doctor, you may be admitted to the Program either from a hospital or from your home. A home care team, in consultation with your doctor, will provide the visiting service you need. Once you are well enough, you will be discharged from the program and referred to other community services as needed.
