GDHS teams get on track

Georgetown District High School's track team took part in the Snowball Relays this weekend at St. Mike's in Toronto with a number of teams recording fine performances.

The midget boys team of Dave Paul, Rob Jickling, Dave Fisher and Jeff Amato was second in the 4 x 800 relay with a time of 9:06.2. The Open Boys team of Kevin Powers, Andy Kiss, Yanne LeTarnec and Ken Hess were in a tie for fourth in their race with a time of 8:22. Also competing in the Open boys class were the teams of David Banks, Nick Parker, Mike Wood and Jim Clark along with Allen Bray, Brian Doherty, Richard Van Der Wahl and Rick McGregor.

The junior boys team of Kiss, Amato, Paul and Wood was second in the 4 x 1600 meter race, finishing in a time of 19:38. LeTarnec, Van Der Wahl, Doherty and Clark, along with Powers, Fisher, Parker and Hess also competed.
