A proposal to have a year-round showplace for equine history, education and exhibitions has been made by the Ontario Equestrian Federation to the Ontario Heritage Foundation.

The Equestrian Federation would like to see the 540 acre Bennett estate in Ballinafad be made into Ontario's first "Heritage Horse Park", open

Their proposal was included in a tourism study for Halton region by Peter Barnard Associates.

The Equestrian Federation set up a committee to study the feasibility of a permanent horse park at Scotsdale Farm (the Bennett estate) and sent a letter proposing this use of the property to the Heritage Foundation two years ago. The Bennett's left their property to the

Heritage Foundation in 1982 when they died. Representatives of the Horse Park Committee are continuing to promote the horse park for Scotsdale Farm with the Heritage Foundation.




