Horse park proposal

A proposal to have a year-round showplace for equine history, education and exhibitions has been made by the Ontario Equestrian Federation to the Ontario Heritage Foundation.

The Equestrian Federation would like to see the 540 acre Bennett estate in Ballinacree made into Ontario's first "Heritage Horse Park", open to the public.

Their proposal was included in a tourism study for Halton region by Peter Barnard Associates.

The Equestrian Federation set up a committee to study the feasibility of a permanent horse park at Scotsdale Farm (the Bennett estate) and sent a letter proposing this use of the property to the Heritage Foundation two years ago.

The Bennett's left their property to the Heritage Foundation in 1982 when they died.

Representatives of the Horse Park Committee are continuing to promote the horse park for Scotsdale Farm with the Heritage Foundation.

Region receives grants

Ontario Environment Minister Morley Kells announced this week that the Regional Municipality of Halton is eligible for provincial grants totalling \$212,381 for the construction of a 600 mm and 525 mm trunk sanitary sewer from Beryl Road to the Clearview Community, and a 525 mm trunk sanitary sewer from Clearview to the North Service Road in Oakville.

As the bylaw officer, Mr. Lusty said his only concern with licensing the amusements company was to make sure they had insurance. Making sure they're safe and safely operated isn't up to him.

"We don't have the facilities here. We don't have anybody who knows about this stuff. It's silly to say we should be doing that when there's nobody who can do it," Mr. Lusty said.

He said although the company didn't show him any safety certificate, he was told by them they had just been inspected in Guelph where they were coming from.

Issuing licenses to midways is done about seven or more times a year, primarily for the Acton and Georgetown fall fairs, the Optimist Club's Bang-O-Rama, the Speyside games and other community events.

"I know myself, I just love those sorts of things. I go to Canada's Wonderland and run from one of those rides to the other," Mayor Russ Miller said. "Had I not had a busy night Friday, I might have had a grandson up there myself."

The mayor said the town licenses are "just more or less so we know what's going on, and too, we get a little revenue out of them."
