The million-dollar gymnasium slated for Stewarttown Senior Public School has been put on hold pending the outcome of the consolidation study in Halton Hills.

Construction had been scheduled to begin in March, 1986 for a September, 1986 completion.

Roof repairs at Joseph Gibbon, replacing windows at Harrison School and carpeting at Centennial have also been put on hold until after the consolidation study.

The information comes from the 1985 plant restoration program which was passed at the board's Thursday meeting.

**BARBECUED SPARE RIBS**

Brown ribs in oven for 20 minutes. Pour off fat.

Combine:

- 1 can tomato soup
- 1/4 cup vinegar
- 1/4 cup ketchup
- 1/4 cup Worcestershire sauce
- Salt to taste
- 1/4 tsp. dry mustard
- 1 tbsp. chili powder
- 1 tsp. butter
- 1 tsp. brown sugar
- 1 onion, chopped fine

Simmer sauce in pan for 5 or 10 minutes. Pour over ribs and simmer in oven for 2 hours at 350°.
