

STRONG REPRESENTATION

The elementary school system in this province is the cornerstone, and the government is committed to strengthening it for the benefit

SKILLS TRAINING

Co-op education programs will have funding increased 66%. A new budget for University Research funding will provide \$30 million over three vears.

CHILD CARE

These will help create 7500 new day care spaces, and Halton has been allocated 350 so far.
