Sponsored by the Brampton-Mississauga District Labour Council, the service is free and avallable to Halton Hills residents.

Looking for a job can be depressing, and the counsellors at the Labor and Community Services office know it only too well.

They were all unemployed with diplomas in social services or psychology degrees, when they were hired 18 months ago for this new project.

"We've seen some 500 people since then," Mr. Farnum said.

The office subscribes to daily newspapers, shares job search techniques with the unemployed and helps write up resume and covering letters for them.

"Some people have lost their phone, and we'll act as an answering service for them for calls from potential employers," Mr. Farnum said. drop-in type of



assistance. Looking for a job is like a game of mono-

poly, Mrs. Slawson said. "If you know the rules of the game, you get to be a better player," she said. "And you get to be a better player the more you play."


Some people are very unrealistic when they come looking for a job. Mrs. Slawson told of a 16-year old who dropped out of school and wanted
