18 from 9 a.m. until noon. All proceeds will go to the underprivileged of the community.



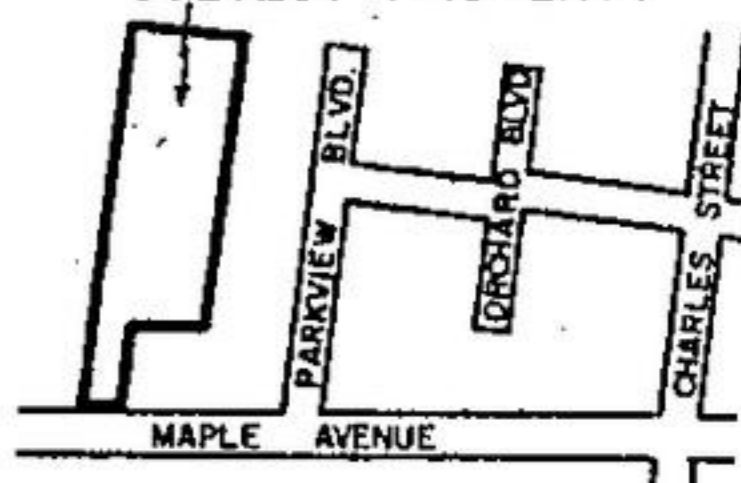

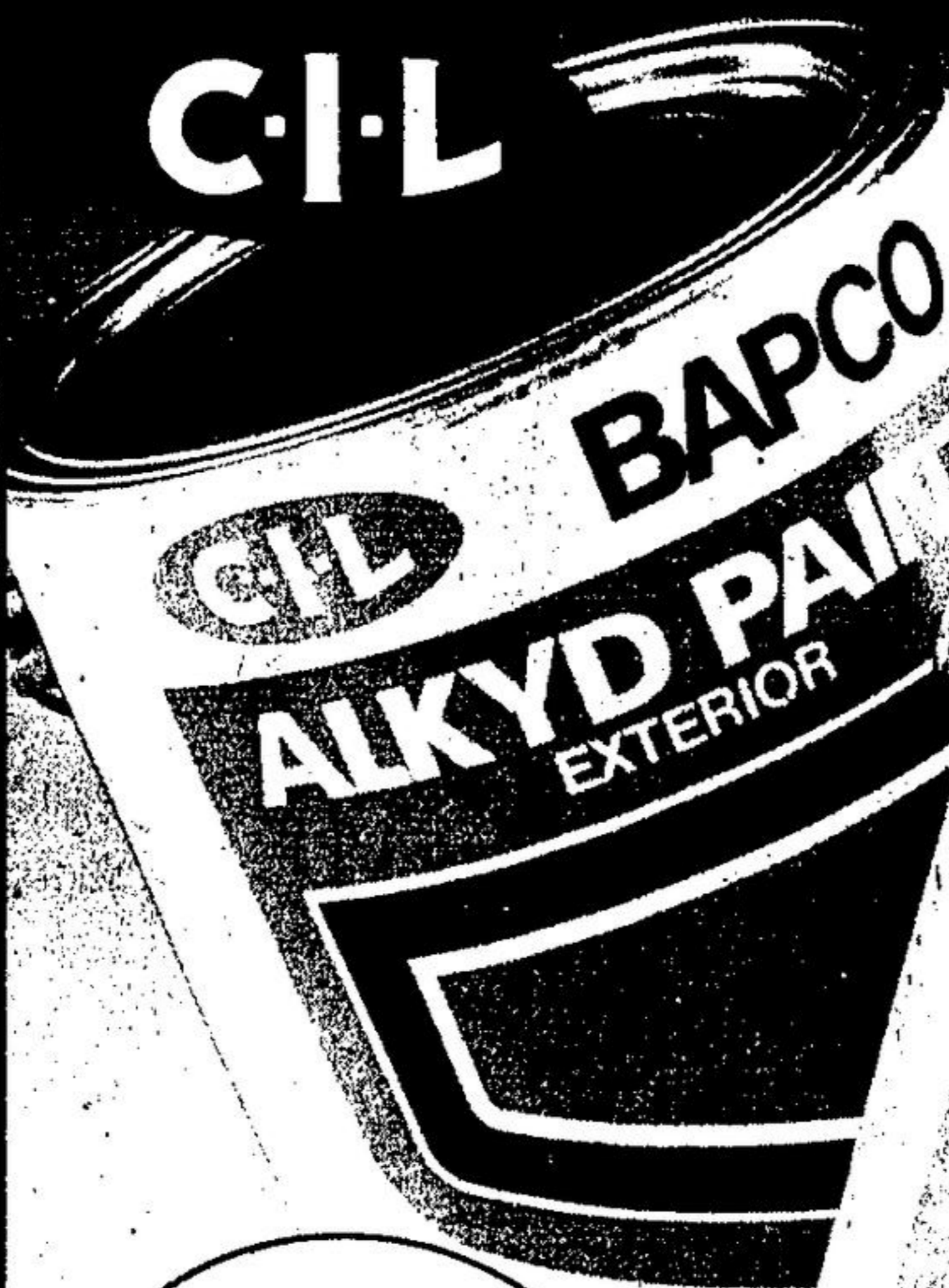
