Georgetown squash duo find little time between events

This was a busy week of squash for Steve Eastwood and Lloyd Newman.

The two Georgetown natives took part in the Canadian National

championships held in Ottawa, then had to come home to play in the Georgetown Racquet Club's singles tournament. The national tournament began Thursday and finished up on Sunday, while the local club event was held Saturday.

Both competitors left Ottawa early Saturday morning in order to make it back to Georgetown. However playing so much squash in the limited time period did not bother Eastwood, who competed in the under-18 class at the national event and finished up with a win against two losses.

"I wish I could have played more," he said. Eastwood ran into some bad luck in Ottawa. His first match was against the division's second seed, and he dropped a 3-0 score. After rebounding with a 3-0 win of his own, the 14-

year-old met the fourth seed, and lost out on a narrow 9-5 score in the deciding game of the best-of-five set.

"I was happy with the way I played, but I wasn't happy with my draw," he said.

For Eastwood, who later won the Georgetown Racquet Club's "B" Division title and has been competing just over a year, the Ottawa event was the biggest one he has competed in.

The 16-year-old Newman had to play a match early Saturday morning, which ended up being a

five-set game that he ended up losing 9-6. He said having to play a tough match in the morning and then another in the afternoon (the "A" Division final at the Georgetown Racquet Club squash event) was a little tiring.

Terry Madill scored a 3-2 decision to win the "A" final, but Newman said it wasn't because he was tired.

At the national event Newman won four of his six matches, and finished in the top 15 overall. He said he was happy with his achievement.
