Step into Ontario's rural past and enjoy a day in the country at the Ontario Agricultural Museum at Milton.

The Museum will be opening for its seventh season, May 13, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily until October 14. This 32 hectare living history Museum of over 30 buildings and displays traces the evolution of agriculture in Ontario.

The Gambrel Barn will be officially opened on Wednesday, May 15. This 60' x 130' structure will serve as a multi-purpose activity centre, providing a home for the Museum's educational programs, temporary exhibits as well as a meeting place for interested groups and associations.

A special exhibit, "Quilts - A Continuing Tradition", will feature

a display of antique, traditional and contemporary quilts. These will be on display at the Museum July 6 to August 25.

More than a Museum and more than a farm, the Ontario Agricultural Museum provides an ideal outing for the whole family.

The Museum is located 8 km west of Milton (from Hwy 401 take exit 320B or 312 north). Admission is \$2.50 for adults, \$1.50 for students, \$1.25 for seniors, \$1 for children and a family rate of \$6.

# Peter Appleyard wins one more fan

They introduced him as one of the world's foremost musicians and said he was a Canadian too. They said he's had a TV series and its reruns are still being aired.

They even said he's played with "greats" like Frank Sinatra, Benny Goodman and Ella Fitzgerald.

In that audience of 200 or so, I think I was the only one who'd never heard of Peter Appleyard. Blush blush.

Thursday night, he won another fan.

The silver-haired gentleman from Rockwood with the bushy white eyebrows hypnotized me with his easy-to-listen-to music.

For anyone else similarly ignorant regarding the likes of this wizard of jazz and romantic tunes, Mr. Appleyard plays the vibraphone.

Okay, I know your next question. The vibraphone was new to me too. It's like a table with xylophone bars on it, little fans whizzing the air underneath them, a foot pedal and what look like organ tubes on the side.

What an instrument. It's so relaxing to listen to.

Sitting there in the John Elliott Theatre, I closed my eyes and imagined myself relaxing in a classy cocktail lounge with a frothy strawberry pineapple concoction and elegant couples doing the foxtrot on a wooden dance-floor. All while Mr. Appleyard and his musical friends Scott Alexander (bass), Gerry Fuller (drums), and Charles Mountford (piano) played Frank Sinatra's "On Days Like These" and "Night and Day".

It wasn't all mellow stuff. There were some peppy tunes, like "Take the A Train" by Duke Ellington and Mr. Appleyard's composition "PEI

polka". While his shiny black patent shoes tapped vigorously to the beat, the smiling musician bounced his batons lightly and quickly across the vibraphone.

That's what was so great about this man. His smile. You could tell he loved what he was doing, playing song after song from memory, chatting up the audience during breaks, telling them anecdotes about Joan Rivers, Frank Sinatra and the rest of his musical peers.

Two rows down from me, a lady in a pink dress started clapping along, when just shaking her head to the music and snapping her fingers wasn't enough. And when Mr. Appleyard said he was going to play Duke Ellington's "Caravan", there was an audible gasp from this same lady and I half expected her to leap on stage and wave her pink scarf. Heaven only knows what restrained her.

Besides the amusing stories, there was a serious side to Mr. Appleyard's performance. He dedicated a song to a good horsingiding friend of his who recently passed away, Joy Lindvik, Master of the Ennisclaire Hunt.

It was actually another horsingiding friend who arranged the fund-raising performance for the Friends of the Halton Hills Libraries, Joan Lister.

They said Mr. Appleyard will be in concert at Ontario Place July 6, at The Forum, and Aug. 1 to 5 in London, Ontario for the Royal Canadian Big Band Festival.

If you're like me, after one of his concerts, you'll drive home in a silent car, because you won't be able to bear the raucous tunes coming out of your car radio.

mutually beneficial, she said.

When children see pornography all the time, they will think that what they see is normal, said Mrs. Rutherford.

Parents are sometimes not aware of pornography and its effects on children, she said.

The city of Toronto had a by-law that licensed stores that sold adult magazines and their employees, provided that the magazines would be placed in opaque covers and provided that they be placed a certain height above the floor.

In October of 1984 Divisional Court decided the provisions of the by-law were void.

Divisional Court decided that the by-law was vague and uncertain in its definition of adult magazines and that it infringed on criminal law. The Municipality of Metropolitan Toronto has decided to appeal to the Ontario Court of Appeal.

Burlington has a by-law geared to corner stores selling adult magazines, but it doesn't apply to stores whose primary business is selling reading material. Those stores are asked to use as much discretion as possible in the sale of adult magazines.

Delrex Smoke Shop, a local variety store keeps their adult magazines, at least five feet high off the ground and has the covers out of view. Henry Harris, store owner said that he is advised to do so by the distributors of the magazines.
