Porcelain puts Grace in Vancouver art exhibit

A local potter has received a materials assistance grant from the Ontario Arts Council to help her put on a show in Richmond, British Columbia.

Grace McKnight of Charis Pottery will have 40 of her crystalline glazed porcelain pieces in an exhibition at the Richmond Art Gallery from June 27 to July 8. She'll be present for the opening.

Richmond is a suburb of Vancouver.

Ms. McKnight won a spot in the juried two-person show after sending slides of her work to the gallery last fall.

"I was really thrilled with that," she bubbled. This is her first time applying for a grant. It also was juried, on the

basis of quality of work.

The two person show will feature a British Columbia watercolor artist, Len Gardiner, with Ms. McKnight.

The pottery Ms. McKnight is shipping off, thanks to the grant, are all vase type forms. The crystalline effect takes a couple of weeks to accomplish and there aren't many potters in Canada who do this complicated process.

Besides at her own gallery in Glen Williams, you can see Ms. McKnight's talent displayed at the "A show of hands" gallery in Meaford and Kleinburg's Manna gallery.

Ms. McKnight will be putting on a show at Gallery House Sol in Georgetown this fall.

EXTENDED ROMAN CATHOLIC SEPARATE SCHOOL FUNDING

VOTERS SENT A MESSAGE THROUGH THE BALLOT BOX: LET'S MAKE SURE IT WAS HEARD AT QUEEN'S PARK

On May 2nd, voters used the ballot box to send a message to all three parties at Queen's Park.

- The democratic process was bypassed when extended funding was announced almost one year ago for Roman Catholic Separate Secondary Schools.
- We must determine whether the proposed extension is legal and constitutional *before* the government proceeds with costly implementation.

No party has a mandate to proceed with implementing extended school funding for Roman Catholic Separate Secondary Schools. That was the message that was sent through the ballot box on May 2nd, 1985.
