

Don't let heavy traffic on Mountainview: residents

Dear elected representatives:
I am a concerned taxpayer on Mountainview Road South.

The possibility of our street becoming an arterial road to the 401 or industrial complex or maybe become six lanes of industrial traffic shocks me.

When a person makes an application to build something as simple as a garage or a wing to their house, all adjacent resi-

dents are consulted and given the opportunity to object at a public meeting.

Why was this procedure not followed before the town council adopted the town's official plan to identify the 360 acres in Georgetown South for industrial use as was done in October 1982.

Many of my neighbors have newly purchased their homes. Were they told of this proposal?

Mountainview Road South is a residential street!

It is already difficult entering or exiting our own driveways, waiting sometimes 10 to 15 minutes before obtaining access.

Children going to three major schools in the area have to cross Mountainview Road in "busy" traffic.

The YMCA at Sinclair and Mountainview hold daytime programs for

"preschoolers". Whether walking or driving the mothers have difficulty crossing the road with their toddlers "safely".

Many senior citizens live at Sargeant Rd. and Mountainview. They have already expressed their difficulty crossing at the lights or at the crosswalk.

These older people of our community actually live in fear while trying to get across "safely".

There are approximately 58 homes going in at Sinclair and Mountainview. Are the people who have bought or considering buying told they will have a super highway or more huge trucks in the backyard of their \$150,000 dream home?

I would ask the consideration be given to an arterial road in order to relieve the already overloaded industrial traffic, not add to it.

The arterial road could much more logically be the Eighth Line.

There are not nearly as many "residents" involved and the homes are set back far enough not to be affected by widening.

Ask our "police force" about traffic or speeding that goes on every day. They simply do not have the manpower to handle it.

I would urge the council to look into "posting load restrictions" on Mountainview.

The industrial traffic must be eliminated before someone is seriously hurt or becomes a fatality!

Senate reform needs mandate

Dear Sir,
The federal government's recent Senate reform proposals will give Canadians the worst of both worlds: a neutered Senate which remains an appointed haven for patronage.
We warned six months ago in a position paper, by quoting former Prime Minister Lester Pearson, that "When he has an assured majority in the Commons, the Canadian prime minister is the nearest thing to a dictator - if he wants to be one".

This government's proposal will abolish the Senate in all but name by limiting its power to delaying bills by a month or six weeks.

It refuses to consider the direct election of Senators, despite the recommendation of this by a Parliamentary study of Senate reform last year. Instead, the Senators will be appointed half by the federal government and half by provincial governments.

This proposal will guarantee that Western and Eastern Canada, as the two least populous regions, will be at the mercy of the two central Canadian provinces in Parliament - the power base which gave us the National Energy Program and protectionist trade policies for Central Canada.

This is a case of the politicians against the people: this government doesn't trust Canadians enough to give to them direct voting power to elect Senators.

Yet these same Canadians trusted PC candidates last fall enough to give them a massive mandate.
