YES employment counsellors ready

Once people know about Y.E.S. director Edward Tooke is hoping they won't say no to Y.E.S.

Mr. Tooke is the director of the North Halton Youth Employment Service (Y.E.S.), which opens for business this week at 37 Main Street in Georgetown.

The service was developed by the YMCA and has been financially supported by the provincial government, the town of Halton Hills, Georgetown Chamber of Commerce and a variety of service clubs and groups.

Within the week Mr. Tooke and his staff will be setting up appointments with youth in North Halton.

The Georgetown office will serve as the main base for other locations in Milton and Acton, which are scheduled for opening later in the summer.

Y.E.S. has a variety of services for youth. Their program differs from the student summer employment centre because clients are looking for permanent jobs, not just the summer, and they could already be out of the school system, Mr. Tooke said.

Christine Arbie from Acton has been hired as a youth works co-ordinator and employment counsellor for the program. One other staff member has yet to be hired.

The staff help youth through a counselling program which is offered bi-weekly to identify employment possibilities and to develop a plan of action.

There is also a pre-employment training program which takes four days to complete. Clients are taught about how to secure and keep a job through applications, resumes, interview techniques and life skills.

Y.E.S. also acts as a placement service. They

Training is also available for youth who want to start their own business but who might need

some hints on record keeping, staff management and marketing.

Finally, the program offers therapeutic counselling and a follow-up procedure for the first three months after employment.

The program has been tried in other communities and the placement rate there averages about 73 per cent.

A survey in North Halton found that 83 per cent of prospective employers who were contacted indicated a willingness to employ young people referred by Y.E.S.
