Favourite Recipes

CARROT-WHEAT MUFFINS

- 1 c. whole wheat flour
- 1 c. all purpose flour
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 c. brown sugar
- 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/8 tsp. ground allspice or cloves
- 1 c. coarsely grated carrots
- 1 tsp. grated orange rind
- 1 egg
- 1 c. milk
- 1/4 c. molasses
- 1/4 c. butter, melted
- 1/2 c. raisins
- 1/4 c. chopped nuts

Preheat oven to 400°. Measure flours, baking powder, salt, sugar, cinnamon and allspice into a large bowl. Stir in carrots and orange rind. In a small bowl beat egg with molasses and melted butter. Add to dry mixture all at one time, stirring just to moisten. Fold in raisins and nuts. Fill greased or lined muffin tin 3/4 full. Bake in preheated oven 25 minutes. Makes 12 large muffins.
