Public safety comes above financial restraint, the Halton region police chief said last week.

"The need is now. We've attempted to get these (extra staff) before, and it's not our first attempt to get this," Chief James Harding told regional councillors at a special meeting at the Burlington police station.

He was reminded by Oakville Coun. Anne Mivale that public safety is not just crime prevention or nabbing criminals.

"Public safety also depends on clean water and the proper treatment of sewage," Coun. Mulvale reminded Chief Harding.

The region is responsible for doling out the funds for water, sewage and policing in Halton.

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
