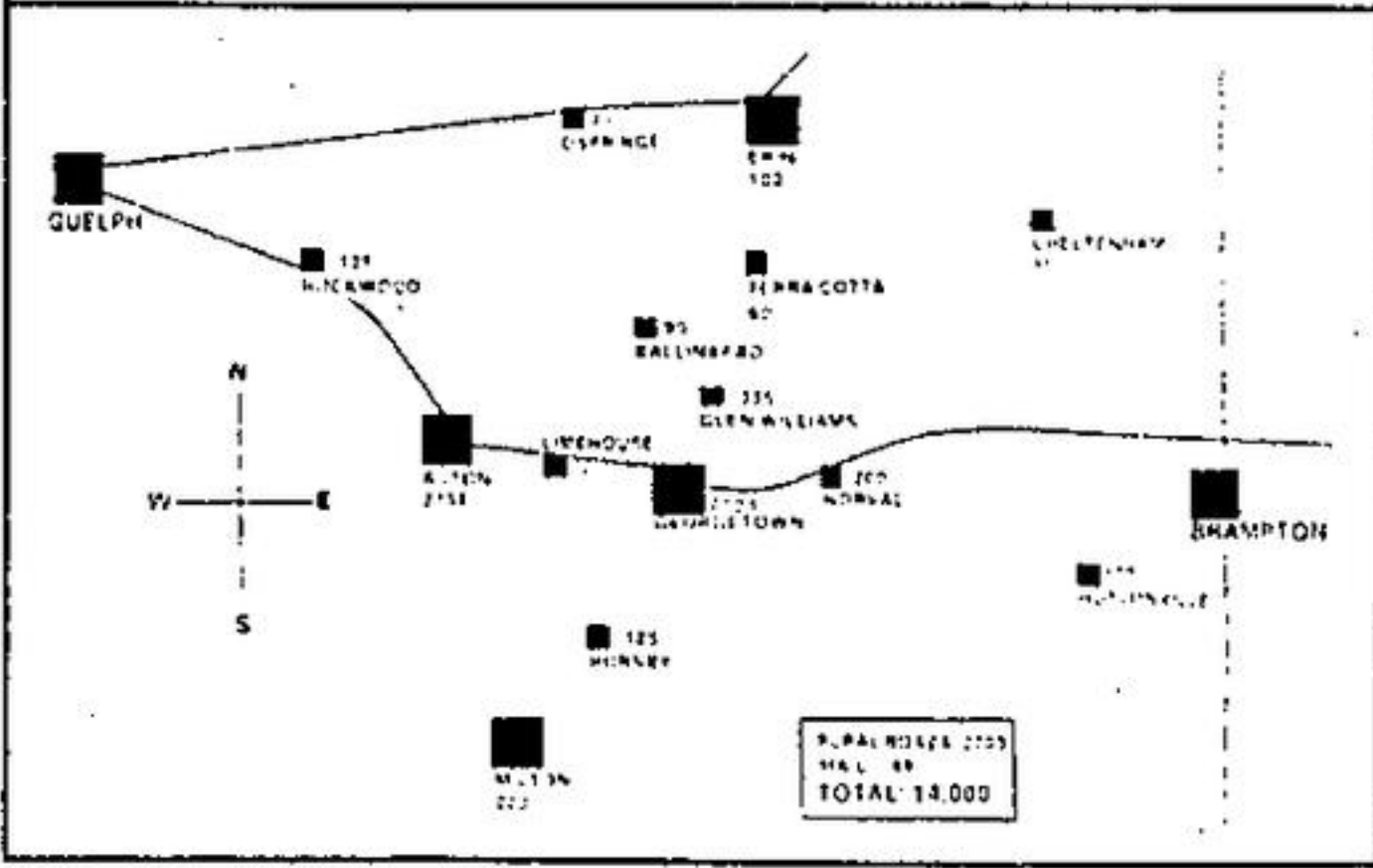

#### Folkloric dance

The Halton Folklore Committee in co-operation with the Oakville Multicultural Council is hosting a performance development workshop for folkloric dance groups in the Halton area. This is a first of its kind of Oakville in an effort to establish a number of skilled dance groups in the Halton community. The clinician is Mr. Edward J. Mavrinc, a graduate of the University of Toronto with an Honors Bachelor of Music and Bachelor of Education. The workshop will be held at the Oakville Centre Sept. 8, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Registration is \$5 per person which includes morning refreshments and lunch. The registration deadline is August 23 and registration is limited.

#### Low bid tender

The low bidder of a tender to replace the asphalt overlay on Guelph Street and Main Street has been awarded the work contract by Halton Hills councillors Monday night. Armbrro Materials and Construction Ltd. of Brampton submitted the lowest bid of four companies, at \$271,032. The town has received verbal approval for the work from the Ministry of Transportation and Communications and is awaiting a formal written response. Work is also planned for Delrex Boulevard, Moore Park Crescent, Todd Road and Armstrong Avenue.

#### Moose hunter workshop

Moose hunters - Improve your hunting skills while learning how to distinguish between a calf, cow or bull in a special workshop, co-sponsored by The Metropolitan Toronto and Region Conservation Authority and two-part session, which runs from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., takes place at two locations, the Cold Creek Conservation Area and the Kortright Centre for Conservation.

At the Kortright Centre, hunters will listen as MNR guest speakers discuss the biology of moose, the selective harvest system and the enforcement of hunting laws. Several films and an open forum for questions complete this session.

At Cold Creek, Lou Romhanyi and his assistants will instruct hunters on the safe use of firearms, field dressing and meat handling. Workshop participants should take their own rifles and ammunition for the practice shooting at moose silhouettes on Cold Creek's rifle range.

A declining moose herd resulted in the introduction of the selective harvest system in 1983 whereby hunters must be able to select between a calf, cow or bull. With the co-operation of better educated hunters, it is hoped that, by the year 2000, Ontario's moose population will have doubled.
