

### CRIME BEAT

#### Petro Canada thief

The Petro Canada station at Trafalgar Road and the Tenth Sideroad was robbed of \$200 to \$300 in cigarettes last Tuesday night (August 13). Entry was gained through a sliding window. Police estimate \$50 damage was done.

#### \$8,500 cigarettes stolen

An estimated \$8,500 in cigarettes, 600 cartons, was stolen from the A and P store at 100 Sinclair Avenue August 14. The thieves entered by dismantling a glass door.

#### Driver damages property

A man driving a Dodge Omni which left Princess Anne Drive while travelling at a high speed caused \$5,200 damage to property and \$3,800 damage to the Omni. He fled from the scene on foot.

The 19-year-old Georgetown man hit a curb, went onto the sidewalk, hit a tree of an 8 Princess Anne home, crossed a lawn and did \$5,200 damage to the home and garden of 8 Princess Anne.

He was charged with dangerous driving, fail to remain and driving without a license, police said.

#### Car lands in ditch

A Brampton man did \$10,000 damage to his 1985 GMC when he drove it into a ditch at 80 km per hour after losing control on a curve.

Ross Gordon Bennett of 195 Kennedy Rd. in Brampton suffered minimal injuries.

#### \$4,000 collision

A Georgetown man driving a 1985 Saab on Steeles Avenue ended up rear-ending a Milton man's 1985 Ford which stopped for a red light.

The accident happened last Thursday (August 15) at 11:25 p.m. Police said the entire front end of the Saab was damaged costing the owner \$4,000 to repair. Damage to the Ford was minor.

#### Cyclist hit by car

Michele Deforest received minor injuries Friday at 2:20 p.m. at the Guelph Street and Mountainview Road intersection when she steered her bicycle from the curb lane into the passing lane.

She was hit by a 1978 Pontiac which tried to avoid her but could not. Damage to the Park Street resident's bike was \$50 and \$200 damage was done to the Pontiac.

#### Truck hits pole

The traffic pole at Trafalgar Road and Steeles Avenue was hit by a large vehicle, possibly a truck, that left the scene on Saturday at 9:45 a.m.

An estimated \$1,500 damage was done to the pole, police said.

#### Bike stolen

A bicycle was stolen Thursday from behind the North Halton Golf and Country Club. The \$150 bike belonged to an employee of the club.

#### Two car collision

The Guelph Street-Maple Avenue intersection was the place of an Aug. 8 accident involving two cars that entered the intersection on amber lights.

An east bound 1978 Ford received \$2,000 damage after turning left and being hit by a 1983 Oldsmobile which received \$3,500 damage.

Dents and gauges were damaged to a 1980 AMC parked in the Glen Williams school yard Thursday between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. The damage totalled \$300.

#### Lightning starts fire

## Package highlights our town flavor to Toyota car firm

Herald Staff If cars can be manufactured in Halton Hills or Halton Region, the Business Development Committee won't stand in anyone's way.

The committee at their last meeting supported the town's proposal to put together a package of information about Halton Hills for the Toyota firm.

Toyota is looking for a site in Canada to manufacture cars for the North American market. If the Japanese firm turns down Halton Hills, the Business Development Committee will support a location in Halton Region, said committee chairman Barry Page.

Mr. Page said he thinks Toyota will locate somewhere between Oshawa and Hamilton. The car manufacturer will have to be close enough to other spin-off industries servicing the automotive plants, he said.

Georgetown South offers a location that is close to a major highway and has a nearby pool of semi-skilled people to work in the highly-automated plant.

Halton Hills may have an advantage because the housing is cheaper than in other areas and

there is a rural setting. "I think we've got something to offer," Mr. Page said.

The Town of Halton Hills planning department is putting together the information package for Toyota. The department doesn't know yet what the site requirements are for the car manufacturing plant, said planner Bob Crews.

"We are simply inviting them to approach us," Mr. Crews said.

The information package will stress Halton Hills' location within the region as being advantageous, he said. Mention will also be made that Georgetown now has an adopted plan

allowing for more than 400 acres of industrial development.

The package will also note the town's close proximity to recreational facilities and natural areas such as the Niagara Escarpment, Mr. Crews said.

Until Toyota indicates how much land they need or discuss matters such as rail access or water and sewage serving and how many employees they need, it's hard to be specific, he said.

It's still not determined whether they want to locate in a heavily industrial area or in more of a suburban location such as Georgetown, Mr. Crews said.
