It is not my intention to promote fear, but to dea! with it. When a child is afraid of the dark it is not reassuring to say "Don't worry about it .. It won't hurt you. There has always been darkness." A responsible parent must help the child look at the fear and take action to manage it.

These days both children and adults are anxious about nuclear war. It is not enough to say "Don't worry. Trust the computers. Don't think about it" or "No problem, the bomb has been around for 40 years."

Let me close with this thought...It will be a




