teaching a watercolor workshop for \$13, Oct. 5. The one-day workshop will cover transparency; use, value and combination when using colors. She'll give a short demonstration and individual instruction as partici-

pants require it. Students must supply their own materials and a sketch or photograph from which to work.

Calligraphy, the art of writing beautifully is a popular course that is being taught by Wendy Buykes of Georgetown, Tuesdays, Sept. 24 to Oct. 29.

The \$19 course looks at the historical development of various scripts and the tools and techniques required to create them. This time-honored craft isn't as difficult as it looks and will give you hours of relaxation. CARDS

Learn to make your own greeting cards, invitations and, to the apprecation of your co-workers, may even improve

your handwriting. Linda Taras is teaching a beginner's course in low relief clay sculpture. The \$40 course is directed towards the creation of wall hanging plaques, with designs incorporating human and landscape forms.

The student will develop skills in the creation of an illusion of the full three-dimensional form from a shallow form through the use of color and learn to perceive objects and groupings of forms that lend themselves to the rendering of relief.
