Murder trial

A Georgetown man is on trial in Toronto accused of the fatal stabbing of a 53-year-old Scarborough father.

Daniel Hawman, 27, and Christopher Fraser, 26 of Toronto are charged with firstdegree murder.

At the Ontario Supreme Court trial the prosecutor told the jury each of the accused blamed the other for the June 11, 1964, killing. Court was told by Mr. Hawman that he stabbed the man because he had been swearing at

him. Constable Herb Foster testified that Mr. Hawman blamed the government for his poor economic conditions contributing to his state of

mind. Police officers hurt

Trustees angry about Representation changes

Trustees of the Halton Board of Education expressed anger and frustration when informed at 'Thursday's school board meeting that the trustee representation issue, thought finally settled, is at the drawing board again.

Regional Clerk David Variey was told by the Ministry of Education that the assessment factors he used to calculate trustee representation were not the factors the ministry wanted him to

The Regional Clerk used factors from July 13, 1985. The ministry would like re-calculations made using July 14, 1984 factors.

The results of this request mean the loss of one public school trustee for Oakville, giving them five; and the gain of one trustee for Burlington, giving them seven. All other trustee seats are unaffected.

One of the problems with this request is it comes after municipal governments all over the region passed by-laws Sept. 1 clarifying where and how many trustees will run in the November election. The request to Mr. Varley was dated August 19 but was postmarked Sept. 3, a date after the laws were

passed. Chairman Betty Fisher said the ministry's unreasonable request was putting Oakville and Burlington in turmoil. "I think it should be stopped and notice should be served!" she exclaimed.




