If you have been exposed to the arts in your formal education then you have an advantage over others. This background means you are well rounded in your character and it can be an area of interest that can give hours of enjoyment in which the stress of everyday life can be alleviated.

If your children find an arts course too 'easy', then demand more. The arts can be as challenging and thought provoking as any other subject depending on the teachers.

Yes, you can make a successful career in the arts. Landscape architecture, planning, architecture, animation, interior design, fashion design, creative writing, photography, various areas of medicine and many more are careers that require artistic training.

No, you do not have to be 'talented'. As long as you are willing to try, there is no reason why you can't learn to appreciate the arts.

Once had a grade 13 student that grumbled continually about the essays, seminars and exams that he had to do for me. He wasn't really talented, but he did try, grudgingly. After a year at Carlton University in engineering he told me this story. He had been walking through a gallery with his engineering friends and was able to point out paintings by Van Gogh, Gauguin, Da Vinci and others. His friends were suitably impressed. He was so very proud of himself; needless to say, so was I.
